8. Outline newest testing and management interventions for GERD and H. pylori and how they are affecting outcomes.
9. Describe an effective approach to treatment of resistant forms of epilepsy in childhood.

11. Propose a multidisciplinary plan to identify adverse events, risks and deploy processes to maximize patient safety.
12. Explore the impact of technology on medical practice.
